

## Carnegie 17 up at the 100s

20 swimmers from Carnegie's Junior Development and Performance Development squads travelled to Prestonpans on Sunday 20 September for the Haddington 100s meet. Competing against swimmers from 21 clubs throughout Central Scotland, the team came away with an impressive haul of 17 medals, including three gold, five silver and nine bronze.

Swimming in the under 10s age group, Fraser Beeby picked up three gold medals in the 100m breaststroke, 100m butterfly and 100m freestyle. In the same age group Sarah Carstairs won a silver in the 100m breaststroke. Megan McGhee (100m freestyle) and Struan Moodie (100m backstroke) collected bronze medals, Megan swimming an impressive PB in the process.

For the 11 year olds Megan Hill won two silver medals in the 100m backstroke and 100m breaststroke, adding a bronze in the 100m butterfly. Not to be outdone, in the boys 100m backstroke, Andrew England won a bronze medal, breaking his PB by 4 seconds.

In the 12 year old category, Samantha Caulfield won a silver medal in the 100m breaststroke and bronze medal in the 100m backstroke, with team mate Aimee Adam winning two bronze medals in the 100m breaststroke and the 100m butterfly.

In the 13 year old age group, Katie Johnstone picked up a bronze medal in the 100m backstroke.

In the 14 and over category Hannah Gray won silver and Amber McWhirter bronze in the 100m breaststroke, Hannah just pipping Amber by 0.1sec.
